PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I would like to invite everyone to our town meeting on Sunday, July 1 at one o'clock in the plaza next to the old firehouse. We have a variety of interesting things to discuss. The Board of Directors has been working on a strategic plan for Friends of Villa Grande that will set out our goals and objectives for the future. We value your input and would like you all to comment on the plan.

We will also have a presentation on the restoration of Patterson Point Preserve. A lot of work has been done in the Preserve but there is still much to do. We'll share a map we have developed that shows what areas have been worked on so far and what is planned for next year. We look forward to your input. The election of Board members will also take place at the town meeting; please renew your membership for 2012-2013 so that you can vote.

I want to remind everyone that the Preserve is now operating under a Land Management Plan that has been approved by the Sonoma County Agricultural Preservation and Open Space District. This plan was required by SCAPOSD as a condition to their financial participation in the acquisition of the Preserve. In addition to the restoration activities spelled out in the plan, a Recreation Covenant requires public access and limited recreational opportunities in the Preserve.

We will be testing several new features this summer, including a portable toilet and limited boat storage. Details of both programs are in other articles in this newsletter. Please let me know what you think of these programs as they develop.

There are two open Board seats, one for a 2 year term and another for a 1 year term. There are also four current directors seek-


ing re-election: Greg Sampson, Victoria Wikle, Ken Wikle and Tom Wackerman.

BOAT ANCHORAGE PROGRAM LAUNCHED

Technically it's not a "boat anchorage" since the boats won't be stored in the water, but FoVG will experiment with a boat storage program where some members will be keeping boats on the gravel beach for the summer. This is a fundraising project, and addresses requests from residents on the hill and also members who have limited mobility.

PORTABLE TOILET AND FOLLY

From Memorial Day through Labor Day, FoVG will be making a portable toilet available at the head of the trail. The primary reason for providing this service is to encourage boaters and beach users of the Preserve to patronize the toilet rather than blazing paths through the underbrush, disturbing the birds' habitat and generally defiling the landscape.

At the suggestion of FoVG member Lon Shapiro, and under Natalie Robb-Wilder's artistic direction, Jon Box and Rich Holmer will build an enclosure or "folly" that will help reduce the visual impact of the portable toilet on the neighbors and users of the path. PPP RESTORATION UPDATE

On May 5, FoVG volunteers sheet-mulched half of the 3rd Street right-of-way at the entrance to the preserve. The mulching is expected to eliminate weeds for 2-3 years. If you want to control your own "volunteer" foxtails, exotic grasses and other nasty weeds, follow these simple steps:

First, clear the area of any non-organic materials, but leave the weeds.

Second, lay down newsprint, in sheafs of 5-10 pages thick, but don't use slick or colored advertising pages. The newsprint should be overlapped 1/4 of the way on each edge with another sheaf of newsprint.

Third, remove all sealing tape, staples and plastic labels from brown cardboard boxes

and flatten them. White and colored cardboard shouldn't be used - recycle them in

your blue bin. Lay down a layer of cardboard on top of the newsprint, again overlapping on all sides to prevent seedlings from growing through the gaps.

Finally, cover the cardboard with a thick layer of redwood mulch or redwood chips - several inches at least. Until it's gone, you're free to take a supply of mulch from the pile on 3rd Street next to the Preserve entrance. Tree trimming companies can also supply you a load of chips for large jobs.

Happy mulching!

PLANTS IN THE PRESERVE: DUTCHMAN'S PIPEVINE

Dutchman's Pipevine (*Aristolochia californica*) is an interesting vine native to river, stream side and woodland habitats. Soft heart-shaped leaves and unusual purplish pipe-shaped flowers bloom in early spring. This deciduous twining plant will need some support if you wish it to grow upwards.



Adaptable, but best with a little shade and moderate water.

Slow to establish, we offer this adage to encourage patience: "The first year it sleeps, the second year it creeps and the third year it leaps". Once established it will put on ample growth, easily covering a trellis or chain link fence. THE larval food source for the pipevine swallowtail butterfly and it is also deer resistant.
