

# FRIENDS OF VILLA GRANDE JOINS THE NO IVY LEAGUE

Long before FoVG purchased Patterson Point Preserve, English ivy had become the parcel's dominant plant. Removal of the ivy has become our top priority and you might be interested to know why.

English Ivy, or *Hedera helix*, is a perennial evergreen vine, introduced to North America in 1797. While the juvenile form has lobed leaves and is a ground cover, the adult form climbs trees, has oval leaves and produces berries which are toxic to most birds.

English ivy was once considered highly desirable in the horticultural trade because it is inexpensive, fast growing, stays green, and can conform to any shape. But now English ivy has escaped from yards and has become a botanic predator. The State of Oregon recently banned all sales of English ivy because of its invasive and adverse ecological dangers.

**Ivy kills trees.** It competes with trees for water and nutrients, covers their bark and reduces their contact with air. Its dense vines block light from the tree's foliage, and the weight of the vines causes premature toppling and increased storm damage. It smothers deciduous understory plants that normally recycle nutrients to the soil around the tree. Last year, one Patterson Point tree toppled over from the weight of the ivy, and we are now waiting to see if several trees that have been cleared of ivy will survive.

**Nothing eats it.** No native wildlife prefers ivy as a food, and few will eat it even under duress. We want Patterson Point to be a habitat for birds and need

to replace the ivy with plants that will provide nutrients for our native fauna.

**Nothing kills it.** Ivy is not significantly affected by any disease or pest. It grows bigger and faster than the natives it displaces. It is shade tolerant and outcompetes the native plants in almost every northwest ecosystem. We've seen how Patterson Point's native plants have been almost totally overwhelmed by the ivy.

**Ivy promotes erosion.** The native riparian vegetation that stabilizes the river's banks and shades smaller streams are replaced by ivy. The shallow ivy roots do not hold soil on slopes, so erosion into streams increases, endangering fish. The additional sediment increases the water temperature, while decreasing the water's capacity to hold oxygen. We need to replace the ivy with plants that will hold the sand and soil of Patterson Point and improve the river's water quality.

**Ivy does not provide good habitat.** Desirable wildlife such as song birds are not attracted; instead ivy harbors rats and mosquitoes.

**You can help.** Avoid planting ivy. Remove ivy from your property and help us remove it at Patterson Point on the third Saturday of every month, between 9:00 a.m. and noon.
