## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

We are at a very exciting time in the work on Patterson Point Preserve. The draft Restoration and Land Management Plan has been reviewed by the Board of Directors and was the subject of a community meeting on Oct. 23. The plan was partially prepared by the Center for Social and Environmental Stewardship (the Center). The remainder of the plan was put together by the Board of Directors with the bulk of the work done by Roberto Esteves. It is well worth your time to sit down and read from cover to cover.

The statement from the Center that I found both enlightening and heartwarming is:

*Considering the small size of the parcel, one would be hard pressed to find an example of greater native woody plant diversity in a comparably sized area anywhere in Sonoma County.*

We have always treasured this property, but it is wonderful to hear it described in such terms by an independent biologist who has worked in Sonoma County for years. It illustrates that our restoration work is important not only to the scenic qualities of our community, but also as a resource for the preservation of biotic diversity. We are truly fortunate to own such a unique piece of property.

The dedicated efforts of the volunteer work crews, under the supervision of Victoria



Wikle, have resulted in the removal and disposal of all of the ivy that was infesting the trees. In addition, each tree now has a cleared area around it to prevent re-infestation. You will also notice that the trails are starting to be outlined with redwood limbs to help define the paths. Thanks to all of the volunteers and especially to Victoria for her diligent work. If you haven't yet volunteered, this is an excellent opportunity for a free physical workout that will match any gym you have ever been to. ## RESTORATION WORK PARTIES SCHEDULED

Now that most of the ivy has been removed from the trees - another 20 cubic yards was hauled away last month - volunteer work parties are focusing on the flat areas. The 2010 bird nesting season has ended, so we can begin a more aggressive removal of the exotic invasive plants in Patterson Point Preserve.

Our strategy is to remove weeds from stands of native plants and trees as well as heavily infested areas. After an area is cleared, we

will mark the perimeter and then wait two years, continuing to weed as needed. The expectation is that the native plants will return naturally without our having to re-plant.

Please come join us, and bring along your empty green recycle bin. Work parties are on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturdays of every month, from 9:00 a.m. to noon, when it isn't raining.

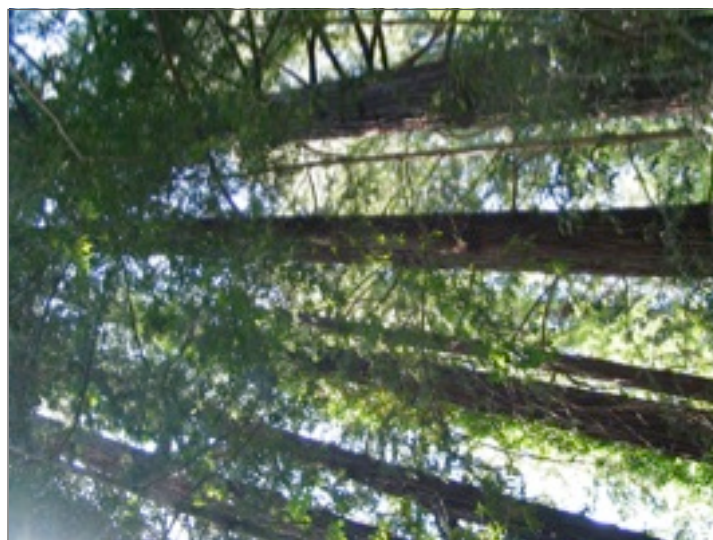
